A social narrative about COVID-19 changes at GCM

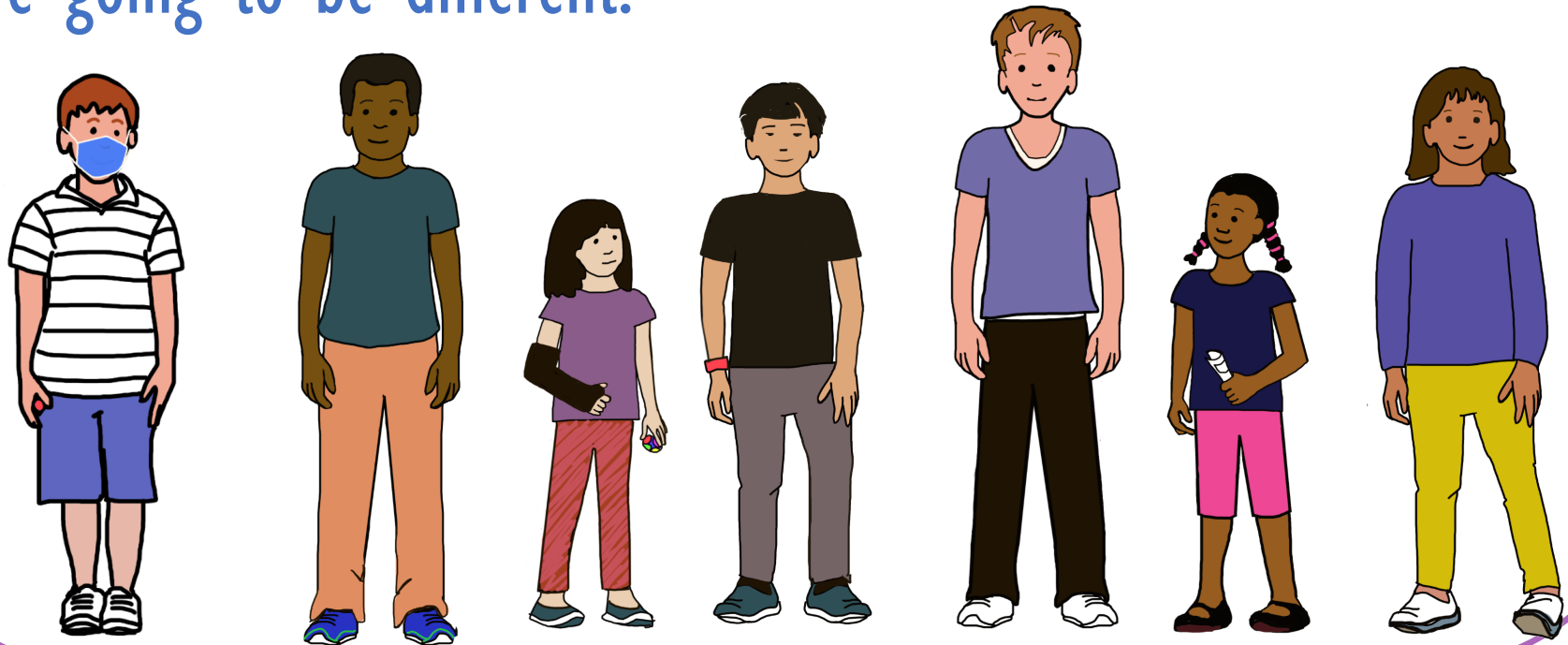
Notes for Caregivers:

- GCM is currently admitting guests at limited capacity and by reservation only. Reservations can be made online and must be paid for at that time; cash payment on site will not be accepted.

I will see lots of people wearing masks at the museum.
According to the new rules, everyone older than 2 years
old must wear a mask. I should wear one too.



I will see hand sanitizer stations in the museum to help keep my hands clean. I will remember to wash my hands and use the sanitizer many times on my visit.



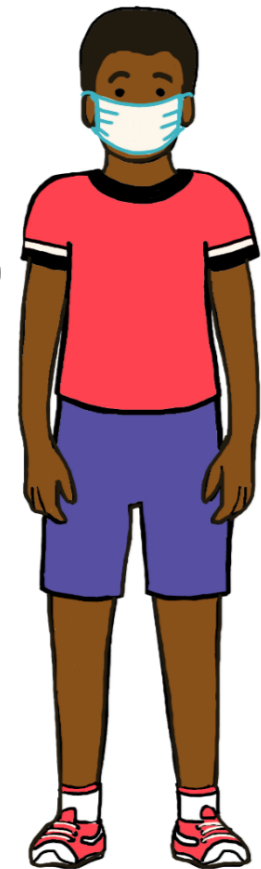
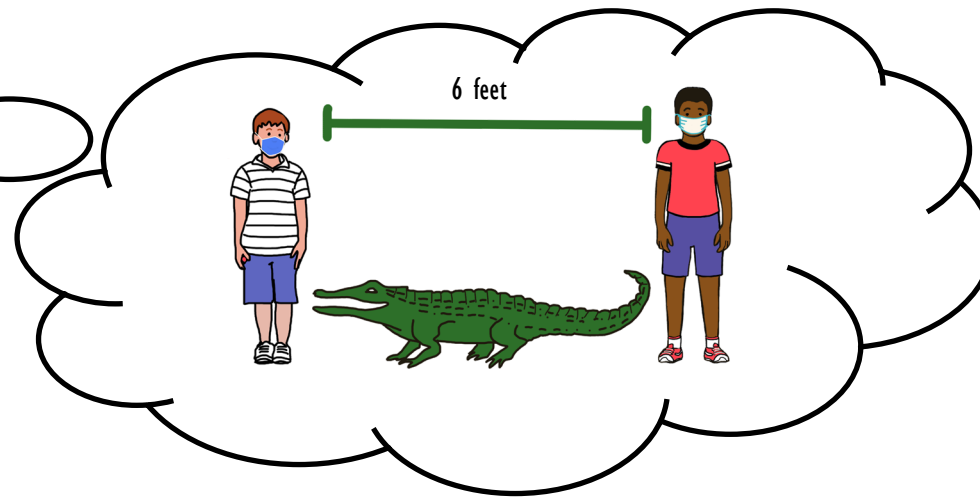
Some exhibits at the museum might be closed, so that they cannot spread coronavirus germs. They will open again someday, when it is safe.



Some exhibits only let a few kids play at a time. I might have to wait my turn. If an exhibit is busy, maybe I can go do something else for a bit and come back later.



I will try very hard to stay with my family. It is important to stand, walk, and play 6 feet apart from other people so that we don't accidentally spread our germs. An alligator is about 6 feet long, so I can imagine there is an alligator between us!



Things are different now at GCM, but I will do my best to follow these rules so that everyone can have fun and stay healthy.



Rules I will try to follow:

- 1) Wash my hands and use hand sanitizer often.
- 2) Keep my distance between other people.
- 3) If the space is too full of people, I will wait and come back when it's not busy.
- 4) I will wear a mask while I play near others.
- 5) Some exhibits will be closed for cleaning. I will come back another time to play there.
